Winter is Here - How We Keep You Moving



As winter settles in, Georgian Bluffs is prepared to keep our roads safe and accessible with the 2026 Winter Operations Plan. This plan explains how snow removal and road maintenance will be managed throughout the season, so you know what to expect.

What does this mean for you?

- Primary Roads First: Main routes and emergency service roads are our top priority to ensure essential travel remains safe.
- Once-a-Day Coverage: Township roads are plowed once per day, depending on snowfall and weather conditions.
- Safety Over Speed: During heavy snowfalls or ongoing storms, clearing secondary routes may take longer, but safety always comes first.
- Salt and Sand Application: High-traffic areas and intersections receive extra attention for traction and safety.

This approach balances efficiency, safety, and cost-effectiveness, ensuring resources are used wisely while keeping our community moving during winter weather.

Council Meeting Schedule Changes for 2026



Starting this January, Georgian Bluffs Council is introducing a new meeting format designed to improve efficiency and enhance community engagement.

What's Changing?

- **New Schedule:** Council will now meet twice a month, on the first and third Wednesday at 5:00 p.m.
- **Combined Format:** Each meeting will serve as both a Council Meeting and a Committee of the Whole, eliminating the need for separate sessions.

Why the Change?

This adjustment streamlines decision-making, reduces redundancy, and ensures discussions remain open and productive. By merging formats, Council can focus on meaningful dialogue while maintaining transparency and accessibility.

All meetings remain open to the public and will be livestreamed on the Township's YouTube channel, making it easy to stay informed from home. Community members are encouraged to participate through delegations and presentations, providing valuable input on local issues. Your voice helps shape decisions that impact services, infrastructure, and the future of Georgian Bluffs.

Reminder: Changes to Recycling Collection



Starting January 1, 2026, the Province of Ontario took full responsibility for managing Blue Box recycling collection under a new producer-responsibility model.

What Does This Mean for Georgian Bluffs?

- Residential Properties: Recycling collection will continue as usual—no changes for households.
- Non-Residential Properties: The Province will no longer collect recycling from industrial, commercial, and institutional (IC&I) properties, including new multi-residential buildings with six or more units.

Most IC&I and multi-residential properties in Georgian Bluffs already use private recycling services, so changes will be minimal. Properties relying on Township curbside collection must arrange alternatives before January 1, 2026.

Next Steps for Affected Properties

The Township has contacted impacted property owners and recommends reaching out to local providers such as:

- Waste Management (Mount Forest)
- Miller Waste (Owen Sound)
