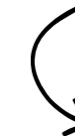

Voting Period

Voting begins on Friday, October 16th at 10:00 a.m. and ends on Monday, October 26th at 8:00 p.m.

Voting options for the 2026 Municipal Election are internet and telephone only.

Ways you can vote:



Vote 24/7 during the voting period online or by phone

Vote at an Election Centre during operating hours



As long as you have a reliable internet connection, you can vote from anywhere. In order to vote, you must have your secure and unique voter credentials.

Voter credentials will be mailed to all eligible voters who are registered to vote in October.

Check to see if you're on the Voter's List

Until August 12th you can add, remove, or update your information with Elections Ontario at [RegisterToVoteON.ca](https://www.registertovoteon.ca)

Check that your School Support Designation is correct

Until June 1st you can update your school support directly through the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation at: mpac.ca/schoolsupport

Starting on September 1st visit georgianbluffs.ca/election or visit the Administration Building to make changes to your voter information.

- Ask questions

Voter Eligibility

Any person who on Election Day (Monday, October 26th) meets the following criteria may vote:

- Is a Canadian citizen
- Is 18-years of age or older
- Resides in Georgian Bluffs, or is the owner or tenant of land in the Township, or the spouse of a person who is.
- Is not prohibited by law from voting.

What you need to vote:

To vote, you will need your Voter Information Letter. These letters will be sent out in October.

Voter Information Letters contain instructions for voting and your unique personal identification number, which is required to log in to vote online or over the phone.

If you don't receive a letter, contact Election Staff for assistance. Identification will be required to request a letter. A list of acceptable ID is posted at georgianbluffs.ca/election

What devices can you vote on?

Voters can use any device that connects to the internet, including: computers, tablets, and smartphones.

If voting by telephone, you can vote using any touch-tone telephone.

There will be no paper ballots for this election.

If you're not sure you have a compatible device, contact Election Staff for assistance.

You may also visit an Election Centre to cast your vote using the provided equipment. The Township will have computers and tablets with accessibility features enabled to assist voters.
